The Premières Côtes de Bordeaux region stretches across hillsides overlooking the Garonne, offering a rolling landscape where vineyards, forests, and meadows blend harmoniously. These exceptional terroirs, shaped by varied soils - clay-limestone, gravel, and silt - and a climate tempered by the river, give the wines a remarkable richness and diversity.


Ideal weather conditions.

These ideal conditions give rise to a great diversity of wines: balanced and structured reds, lively and aromatic dry whites, exceptional sweet wines with subtle sweetness, as well as fresh and elegant sparkling wines, indulgent rosés, and fruity clairets.

The Garonne plays an essential role in the identity of the vineyard, by creating a climate conducive to the optimal ripening of the grapes. It thus fully contributes to the richness and diversity of these exceptional terroirs.

Biodiversity is at the heart of the vineyard.

Hedges, natural meadows, and forests border the plots, promoting ecological balance and soil preservation. Winegrowers are committed to sustainable viticulture, promoting grass cover, reducing inputs, and protecting local species. This harmony between people, the vine, and nature gives the wines a strong and authentic identity, reflecting living and preserved terroirs.



ONE REGION, **EIGHT AOCs**

The 8 AOCs produced in the Premières Côtes de Bordeaux region illustrate the diversity and richness of Bordeaux's terroirs. They share an ideal temperate climate, varied and fertile soils, as well as winemaking expertise that ensures the excellence of the wines. Each appellation has its own identity, reflecting a unique wine heritage between tradition and innovation. The Premières Côtes de Bordeaux region is above all a story of transmission and passion. A new generation of winegrowers continues this expertise while integrating modern and environmentally friendly practices. From passionate reds to fresh rosés, from vibrant dry whites to luscious sweet wines, fruity dessert wines, festive crémants, and refreshing clairets, each type of wine offers a diversity of expressions to discover, taste, and share.





THE SPECIFICITIES OF THE REGION

The Premières Côtes de Bordeaux region stretches 60 km in length and 5 km in width, along the right bank of the Garonne River, between ainte-Eulalie and Saint-Maixant.

UNDERSTANDING THE EIGHT AOCs



AOC CADILLAC CÔTES DE BORDEAUX







TERRITORY:

A narrow strip of land 60 km long and 5 km wide, stretching from Bordeaux in the north to Langon in the south on the right bank of the Garonne river.

GRAPE VARIETIES:

• Cabernet Sauvignon • Merlot Cabernet Franc • Malbec • Petit Verdot

TASTING NOTES:

These red wines are captivating with their aromas of ripe red and black fruits, such as cherry, blackcurrant, and blackberry, enhanced by spicy notes of vanilla or liquorice. Both rich and light, they offer finesse and a touch of originality.

AOC CÔTES DE BORDEAUX







TERRITORY:

A narrow strip of land 60 km long and 5 km wide, stretching from Bordeaux in the north to Langon in the south on the right bank of the Garonne river.

GRAPE VARIETIES:

- Merlot Cabernet Sauvignon
- Malbec Cabernet Franc Petit Verdot

TASTING NOTES:

These wines are distinguished by their elegant roundness, offering a harmonious balance between aromatic richness and finesse on the palate.



AOC PREMIÈRES CÔTES DE BORDEAUX









TERRITORY:

The appellation stretches between the Garonne River and a first succession of hills formerly called the Grandes Côtes. In autumn, the fogs rising from the river combined with the ideal sunshine on the hillsides create optimal conditions for Botrytis cinerea. This microscopic fungus settles on the berries and concentrates their aromas.

GRAPE VARIETIES:

• Muscadelle • Sauvignon • Sémillon

TASTING NOTES:

Sweet white wines with fruity and floral aromas, blending citrus, candied fruit, quince, peach, and yellow flowers. Balanced and elegant, they combine roundness and unctuousness.

AOC SAINTE-CROIX-DU-MONT







TERRITORY:

Right bank of the Garonne; only the commune of Sainte-Croix-du-Mont can claim the appellation. Hilly topography composed of clay-limestone soil on a rocky limestone subsoil containing visible fossilized oyster shells.

GRAPE VARIETIES:

• Muscadelle • Sauvignon • Sémillon

TASTING NOTES:

The sweet wines of Sainte-Croix-du-Mont are distinguished by their captivating aromas of grape, fig, acacia, honeysuckle, apricot, and peach. Powerful and complex, they offer beautiful intensity and a long finish. Ample and luscious, these elegant and remarkably structured wines evolve over time, gaining depth and refinement.



AOC CADILLAC









TERRITORY:

22 communes on the hillsides of the right bank of the Garonne. The «Garonne effect» also, and above all, creates a temperate local climate that defines the uniqueness of the PDO. In autumn, the fogs rising from the river and the sunshine on the hillsides create optimal conditions for the Botrytis cinerea fungus, which settles on the berries and concentrates their aromas.

GRAPE VARIETIES:

• Muscadelle • Sauvignon • Sémillon

TASTING NOTES:

Their subtle aromas of white fruits and citrus mark their youth. Structured and unctuous without being heavy, these wines are distinguished by their great aging potential.



AOC LOUPIAC







TERRITORY:

Right bank of the Garonne; only the commune of Loupiac can claim the appellation.

GRAPE VARIETIES:

• Sémillon • Sauvignon • Muscadelle

TASTING NOTES:


The sweet wines of Loupiac are distinguished by their aromatic complexity, blending candied fruits, exotic notes, fig, and honey, complemented by hints of gingerbread, yellow flowers, acacia, currant, and prune. This fine and generous sweet wine develops even more intense and refined aromas over time.

AOC CÔTES DE BORDEAUX SAINT-MACAIRE









TERRITORY:

Right bank of the Garonne. Ten villages are permitted to produce wines of this appellation.

GRAPE VARIETIES:

• Muscadelle • Sémillon • Sauvignon

TASTING NOTES:

The wines typically exhibit delicate aromas of musk, roasted almonds, green apple, acacia, and vanilla. Round and unctuous, they reveal indulgent notes of dried fruits and honey. Full-bodied and generous, these wines balance richness and freshness with subtlety, offering beautiful complexity and a pleasant, long finish.



AOC BORDEAUX





TERRITORY:

The AOC Bordeaux covers the entire Bordeaux vineyard, and the territory of the Premières Côtes de Bordeaux is fully part of it.



Located in the heart of the Premières Côtes de Bordeaux region, the Cadillac Maison des Vins is a lively and welcoming place, ideal for starting your discovery of the vineyard. From the Château de Malromé, linked to Toulouse-Lautrec, to the Château de Malagar, home of François Mauriac, via the Château de Langoiran and the alleyways of Rions, each site reveals a deep connection between history, architecture, and the culture of the vine, established here since Antiquity.

THE MONUMENTS THAT SHAPE THE HISTORY OF OUR **REGION**

Le Château de Cadillac

This 17th-century castle, residence of the Dukes of Épernon, is a major site of the region's architectural heritage. It offers an immersion into the history of Bordeaux aristocracy and an breathtaking view of the Garonne. A place that is both cultural and emblematic of the appellation.

Village of Sainte-Croix-

This commune offers a spectacular panoramic view of the Garonne Valley. It is also known for its limestone cliffs, fossil witnesses of an ancient sea. A must-see place for lovers of natural landscapes and geology.

An emblematic village in the south of the Gironde, Verdelais has been a major pilgrimage site since the Middle Ages. Dominated by its basilica, it offers an exceptional panorama. This village combines spirituality, heritage, and the art of living in the heart of the vineyard.

A. Saint-Macaire

This fortified medieval village is a preserved site, with its cobbled streets, half-timbered houses, and ramparts. Saint-Macaire is also a starting point for discovering the wines of the appellation. Its ancient charm attracts history and heritage enthusiasts.

5.Le château Malromé

This estate, once the home of the artist Toulouse-Lautrec, combines art, history, and viticulture. It is a must-visit for those wishing to blend artistic discovery with wine tourism.

δ . Le château de Malagar

Château de Malagar was the home and refuge of François Mauriac, winner of the Nobel Prize, in Literature. This emblematic place, steeped in his work, offers an exceptional panoramic view of the Garonne valley.





7. Le château de Langoiran

Château de Langoiran is one of the largest medieval castles in the region. Built in the 13th century, it testifies to the power of the lords of the time. It offers a journey through history, with a breathtaking view of the vineyards and the valley.

8. Village of Rions

Nestled on the banks of the Garonne. Rions charms visitors with its medieval heart, cobbled streets, and ancient ramparts. This village, rich in remarkable heritage, tells the story of centuries past and invites you to wander among old stone walls, scenic viewpoints, and a peaceful atmosphere.


